After a couple of months, we have decided to design a complete font family and sell it for a commercial use. For a regular consistency with our past font work we have decided to call this font with the name of the capital Bulgarian's Republic.

The goal of this new type was to create a sans serif font which give an impression of both modernism, harmony and roundness. These nuances give Sofia a harmonious and sensible appearance for both texts and headlines. Sofia is available in 6 weights and 4 styles.

This OpenType font contains the basic characters of a latin character set layout.
